Throughout your career you have demonstrated true leadership and a commitment to public service. Many of our students are hoping to serve their communities in similar ways.



Dear Dr. Quinn:

I am delighted to know that you will speak at the Graduate School of Public and International Affair's (GSPIA) Graduation and Honors Celebration on Saturday, April 29, 2000.

Nearly 100 students will graduate in the presence of approximately 500 people - the faculty, staff members, and the students' families and friends. Our Honors and Graduation program provides an opportunity for students to truly celebrate, individually and collectively, the accomplishments of the graduating class. This year's graduating class includes:

- 33 Master of Public Administration students;
- 1 Master of Urban and Regional Planning student;
- 18 Master of Public Policy and Management students:
- 23 Master of Public and International Affairs/Economic and Social Development students:
- 67 Master of Public and International Affairs/International Affairs students; and
- 2 Doctor of Philosophy students

Not all of these students will be attending the ceremony since some of them completed their degrees in August or December 1999. Neither of the doctoral students will be in attendance.

The ceremony and reception will be held at the 20th Century Club, 4201 Bigelow Boulevard, near the University campus. The typical keynote address lasts 10-15 minutes. Although the topic is left to your discretion, perhaps you would like to discuss how

changes in society have affected public service in the United States. I am enclosing GSPIA brochures and a recent newsletter that may be of interest to you in preparing your remarks.

Please let me know your flight schedule as soon as possible. As we discussed, GSPIA will reimburse you up to \$560 towards the cost of your flight. This reflects the cost of an economy, round-trip ticket (Des Moines-Pittsburgh-Des Moines). You will need to submit your airline ticket receipt to us while you are here. We will then complete the paperwork necessary for your reimbursement.

We will make arrangements for you to be met at the airport by the Limousine Service upon your arrival; their information is enclosed. (We will also make arrangements for your return to the airport.) The driver will escort you to your hotel, A room is reserved for you on both Friday and Saturday nights (April 28 and 29) at the Hampton Inn – Oakland.

As you know, the dinner on Friday, April 28, begins at 6:00 p.m. If your schedule permits, we would love to have you join us at the Pittsburgh Athletic Association for this function. Dinner attendees will include faculty, staff, alumni, students and honored guests. Please know that we understand you may not be able to attend this dinner, based on your flight schedule.

On Saturday, April 29, a driver will meet you in the lobby of the Hampton Inn at 11:45 a.m. to escort you to the 20<sup>th</sup> Century Club, the site of our commencement and reception. At approximately 12:15 p.m., the deans, platform guests and students arrive at the 20<sup>th</sup> Century Club for donning academic regalia and lining up. Your robe, hood and cap will be provided at this time. The processional begins with the graduating students, followed by the faculty, then platform guests who proceed to the stage.

Please let us know of any individuals in the Pittsburgh area whom you would like us to invite, on your behalf, to the ceremony and reception. We would be happy to include them in the day's events.
